Monetary Donations

Monetary donations are always welcome. HFHSC are a 501(c) 3 organization. Your contribution is tax deductible to the extent permitted by law. All monetary donations are considered part of the general camp fund and will be used to support camp programs unless explicitly agreed to in advance by HFHSC.

Any donations that are received that do not follow the aforementioned guidelines cannot be accepted and will be returned.

Gift Cards

If you would like to donate gift cards with which we can buy specific items campers need, please donate from BJ's Wholesale, Walmart, or Target. Gift cards can only be accepted if sent to Homes for the Homeless Central Office, 36 Cooper Square, 3rd Floor, New York, New York, 10003, with a note indicating that the items are designated for HFHSC.

Any gift cards that are received that do not follow the aforementioned guidelines, cannot be accepted and will be returned.



In-Kind

Our campers benefit from merchandise that is donated, especially essential clothing, personal care items, linens, school supplies, toys, and games. Donations of items such as these make for great drives for scout troops, schools, civic organizations, and corporations. Please help us help the children by adhering to the following considerations.

Because storing merchandise in an outdoor environment is challenging, in-kind donated merchandise must be approved in advance with an authorized agency representative. Once approved, they can only be sent and received at Homes for the Homeless Central Office, 36 Cooper Square, 3rd Floor, New York, New York, 10003.

We **cannot accept donations that are delivered to camp** or to third parties. Some exceptions can be considered (landscaping supplies, for example), but **must be arranged in advance** with an authorized agency representative before delivery can be arranged and will be accepted.

In general, most in-kind donations must be **new or in clean, like new, condition**. Any items deemed unsuitable due to wear and tear or damage cannot be accepted.

Any items that are received that do not follow the aforementioned guidelines, unfortunately, cannot be accepted and will be discarded.
